



USSAAC - Four Rs in the Disaster Cycle Readiness, Relief and Recovery and Resources



Lack of preparedness IS a disaster!

WHO IS AT MOST RISK?

People with disabilities and access and functional needs (AFN)

People with speech and language disabilities, especially those who rely on AAC.





READINESS

Readiness Make a Plan Pack a Bag (Disaster Specific) Practice the Plan Revise the Plan

- Get Informed. Stay Informed
 - What disasters are most likely to occur in your area?
 - Download apps to both learn about and receive weather updates
- Make a Plan
- Pack a Go Bag (AAC specific focus)
- Practice PLAN, REVISE & UPDATE Go Bag

ROLE OF SERVICE PROVIDERS?

- Have a personal preparedness plan. You can't help others if you are not prepared.
- Be familiar with your employer's plans (evacuating or sheltering in place)
 What if the event occurs suddenly,

when clients are on premises.

3. How will you communicate with your colleagues and clients?

- 4. Are records safe? How can you access them if you can't get into your office?
- 5. Do you have a plan to assure continuity of operations (COOP)?
- 6. What are your payer-mandated requirements (e.g. CMS requirements for home health, hospitals, LTC)


Prepare NOW


- Sign up for your community's warning system. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.
- Know your community's evacuation plans and find several ways to leave the area. Drive the evacuation routes and find shelter locations. Have a plan for pets and livestock.

Alert My Emergency Contacts

ICE4Autism can send an **emergency alert text message** -- including your GPS location and a link to your location pinned on Google Maps -- to your designated emergency contacts. Parents, spouses, caregivers and service providers can come to your side, advocate for you and help you through the ordeal.

Special Instructions

The Special Instructions widget is the place for you to tell first responders whatever YOU decide is most important!

Special Instructions

It may be that you are particularly noise sensitive, have an unusually high pain threshold, or that you are non-verbal and use your iPad to communicate; it may be that just because you nod your head does not necessarily mean you understand or that you are particularly frightened of needles; or it may be a request that they answer your phone if it rings, because it's probably your worried mom, dad, husband or wife wanting to make sure you are OK.



ICE Audio - ICE4Autism can speak for you or your loved one

If you or your loved one is non-verbal or incapacitated due to injury, the simple press of a button plays YOUR pre-recorded message including the most important information about YOU, your sensitivities, unique behaviors and anything else YOU decide is vital to your care.



Background

- Christopher George 23 years
- Chandler George 21 years
- Resides in Houston, Texas USA



- Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) device users for over 20 years.
- lived in different states in US and for the last 20 years have settled here in Houston

Education Background

• Our relationship with Special Education of Alief school district



- both attended full time Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)program for few years
- Rest of the education is in Alief School district special education program.

History of AAC services and devices

- Started with low-tech services 20 years ago
- Picture exchange cards (PEC) system, Basic communication flip boards, AAC boards, Big Mack, Go talk to DYNAVOX /Speech Generating Device SGD) or Voice Output Communication Aids (VOCA), iPad, iPad mini
- At least for the over 15 years, using high tech devices. Harvey Hits Houston

 Harvey, tropical depression category 4 hurricane, costliest tropical cyclone on record, from catastrophic rainfall-triggered flooding in the Houston metropolitan area and Southeast Texas made landfall on August 25, 2017. The damage estimated from Harvey was at least \$125 billion



Preparedness

- signed up for community warning systems e-mail and text alerts or Emergency Alert systems information
- stocked food, water, medications, flashlights, candles, batteries, cash, gas cooking cylinder, first aid supplies, filled full tank gas

Harvey's Impact 2017


Preparedness

- Chandler had working devices during the time of the incident
 - The devices had a limited life span and did not last during the power shortage.
 - Once the power had came back the devices would not properly charge and Chandler was unable to use the devices.
- Christopher 's STAP application was still pending
- There was no further backup plan set in place at the time

Harvey's Impact 2017

Recovery

- Once we were able to get electricity and internet, we had to do our own research about the updates for the resources
- Family to Family Network
 - Email with a link to the USSAAC application
- The SLP[Ms.Elizabeth Begley] had came to our home to help set up and pick the effective devices for our children's needs





What we learned from Harvey about People Who Use AAC (PWUAAC)

- AAC user who are **non-readers** need **vocabulary**
- AAC users need to understand disaster vocabulary


Phrase Ideas: *Recovery* and long-term.

- Relevant phrases will be determined by what happened before and during the disaster.
- As with all important events (positive and negative), individuals who rely on AAC want to share what happened
 - With many people
 - Over an extended period of time.
- Visual Scene Displays may be excellent match for the recovery phase. Photo books help children tell and retell their stories.

Vocabulary Review



Can be used as a Bingo or Tic-Tac-Toe Board with discussion about why a scene IS or IS NOT an emergency.



Match the Emergency or Community symbol with its Meaning.



Highlight and discuss vocabulary From FEMA videos. Look for HAZARD symbols online or at school.

Helping your students be prepared

- ✓ Develop units on emergencies and disasters for students across the age span that includes a focus on relevant vocabulary for the age/grade level.
- ✓ Check that the vocabulary is available within the AAC system(s) so that the child can be a full participant in discussions on Emergencies, Safety, and Planning.
- ✓ Consider discussing **Emergency Preparedness** as part of any Transition Plan.
- ✓ FEMA has a series of short videos on YouTube that discuss and explain Emergency and Disaster Vocabulary. These can jump start a conversation about Preparedness.

Be a Part of the Solution! (People who use AAC and their families)

- Make a plan practice the plan!
- Learn about and **participate in emergency** planning efforts in your community.
- Be a volunteer! Participate in disaster drills; join a VOAD.
- Identify yourself to first responders and emergency personnel but understand the limitations of registries.
- Sign up for emergency alert systems.
- Understand the terminology e.g. storm warning vs. storm watch.

- Make a plan practice the plan!
- Learn about and participate in **emergency planning** efforts in your community.

- Join a VOAD.
- Provide users with appropriate vocabulary and terminology.
- Create and share social stories about emergencies and disasters.

USSAAC Disaster Relief Grants: Purpose

- Build applicant's knowledge/capacity in the area of emergency preparedness
- Restore AAC capacity in a region affected by disaster (US)
- Promote /support personal preparedness training for people with complex communication needs and their families
- Provide training to professionals/volunteers in the emergency management system to better support people who use AAC (e.g. shelter staff; emergency planners; first responders)



USSAAC Disaster Relief Grants: Eligibility

- USSAAC members, including higher ed faculty on behalf of their students
- USSAAC members who are disaster survivors, or who reside in an area frequently experiencing natural disasters
- Individuals who use AAC/families who have received services from USSAAC's Disaster Relief Committee



USSAAC Disaster Relief Grants: More Info

- Activities may include: attend a conference or meeting on disaster preparedness; present at a conference on this topic; conduct a training on personal preparedness for people who use AAC/their families
- Up to **\$1000** (includes expense REIMBURSEMENT)
- Competitive application process
