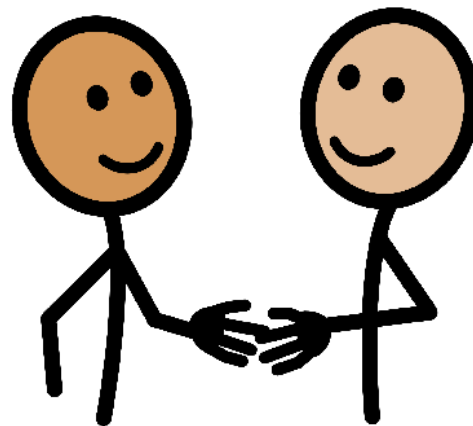

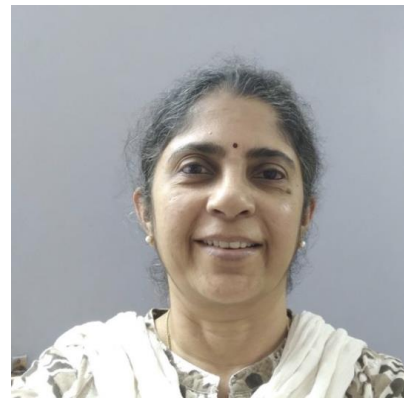

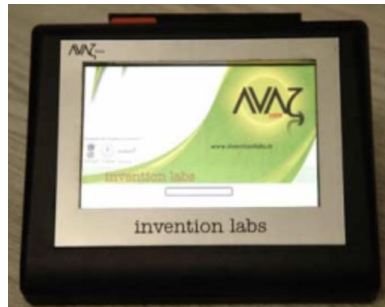

Background Information

High tech AAC in India

- Avaz - first indigenous high-tech AAC
- Introduced in 2010
- 1983 - Dynavox available in USA



Pre-2010

- Limited awareness about AAC (esp high tech)
- Limited knowledge of complex communication needs and AAC intervention
- High tech AAC - imported and exorbitantly priced

Indian context



- Enormous paucity of speech therapists in India
- Population served per SLP
 - India 2,72,000
 - USA 2500

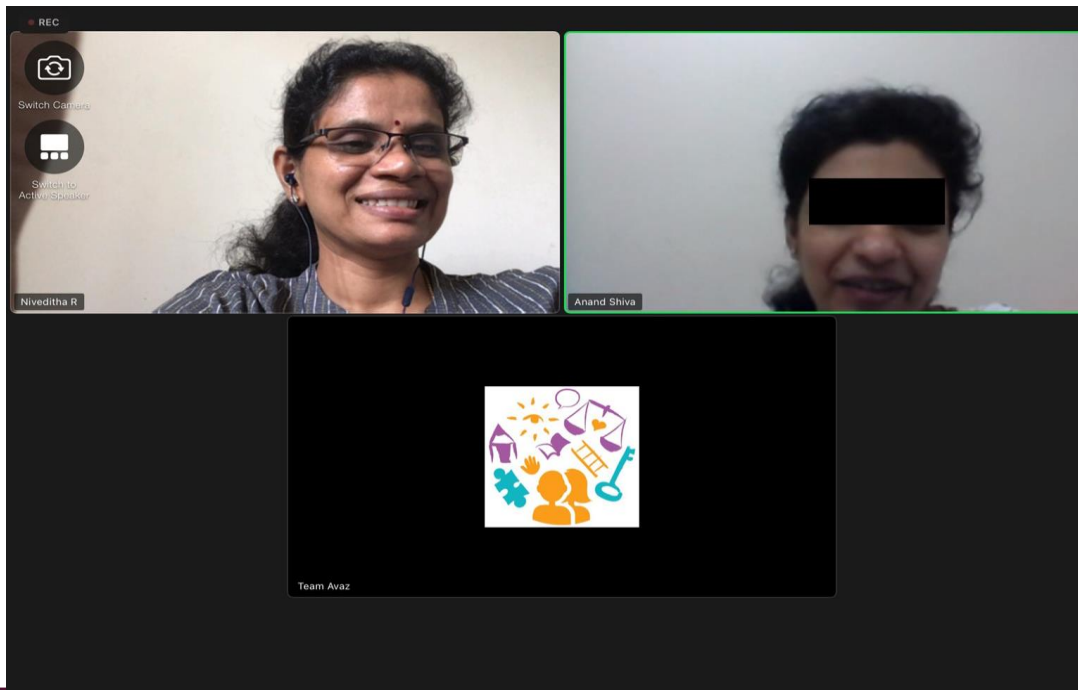

 - Sharing resources
 - Giving Home-practice
 - Observing the parents during session -> feedback -> improvement

AAC EVERYDAY CORE WORDS

WANT

WANT IS ONE OF THE MOST COMMONLY USED WORDS TO GET STARTED WITH AAC AND IS USED TO EXPRESS DESIRE.

TAP THE WORD WANT + SPEAK THE SENTENCE ALOUD + STRESS ON WANT

PLAYTIME
I WANT to play ball.
What do you WANT to play?

MEALTIME
I WANT a banana.
Do you WANT a sandwich or banana?

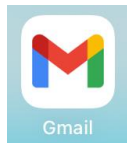
PAINTING
What do you WANT to paint?
I WANT to paint the lion.

CHOOSING CLOTHES
What do you WANT to wear?
What color shirt do you WANT?

CLEANING
I WANT to clean the room.
WANT to help me clean?

GOING OUT
Where do you WANT to go?
Do you WANT to go to the park or movie?

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NOT, DON'T

AAC EVERYDAY CORE WORDS

NOT DON'T

NOT AND DON'T REPRESENT IMPORTANT CONCEPTS OF NEGATION THAT CAN BE TAUGHT & USED IN DAY-TO-DAY ACTIVITIES.

TAP THE WORD **NOT / DON'T** IN YOUR AAC SYSTEM.
SPEAK THE SENTENCE ALOUD
STRESS ON THE WORD **NOT / DON'T**

MEALTIME
I do **NOT** want a banana.
I do **NOT** like carrot.

WATCHING TV
TV is **NOT** on.
This is **NOT** a computer.
(point to the TV)

ANYTIME
This is **NOT** a chair
(point to table)
This is **NOT** a table
(point to chair)

GENERAL
DON'T stand on the chair. You will fall.
DON'T put water on the floor.

COOKING
Do **NOT** spill the oil.
Do **NOT** touch it - it is hot.

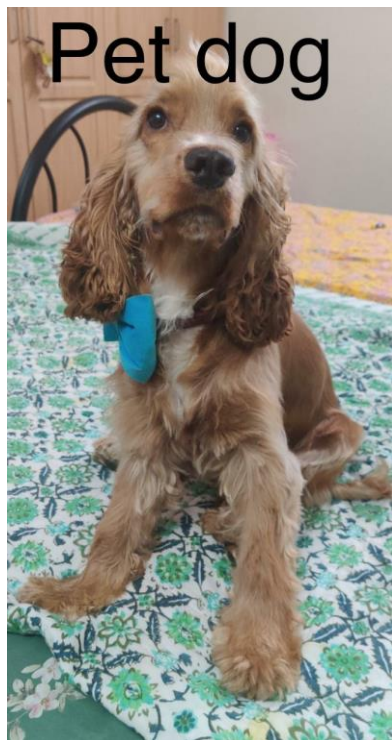
PICKING CLOTHES
This is **NOT** blue.
(point to red t-shirt)
This is **NOT** a shirt.
(point to jeans)

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Resources shared- Prompting hierarchy

Nature of Prompt	Type of Prompt	Description (Partner behavior)	Example
LEAST INTRUSIVE	Independent	No guidance is needed	No guidance - user responds independently
	Expectant pause	Have an anticipatory look to indicate that you are expecting a response	User comes to you for chips - have an anticipatory look to indicate that you are expecting a response.
	Indirect Verbal	Give an indirect verbal hint that indicates to the user that something is expected.	"Where should you tap next?" OR "Vroom vroom, you want the car to ____ (GO)"
	Partial verbal	Say what has to be done without telling the word to be tapped	"You need to tap the icon for me to understand" Or use your Avaz
	Direct verbal	Give a verbal instruction to the user telling him exactly what to do.	"If you want the car to GO, choose or tap "GO" "
	Gestural	Use gestures, such as hand pointing/head nod/looking at the icon/point towards an item.	Point to the "GO" button from above the screen and gesture the tapping action.
	Modelling	Show the user what to do by modelling or demonstrating the action yourself	Tap the GO button while speaking "You want the car to GO"
	Partial physical guidance	Provide gentle nudge (at elbow or shoulder) to guide the user to complete the task.	Gently tap the elbow or shoulder to prompt the user to respond correctly.
MOST INTRUSIVE	Full physical guidance	Gentle guidance is provided to help the user complete the entire step or activity	Hand-under-hand prompt - Keep the user's hand on top of your hand as you guide it to tap the word GO .

To try NOT activities	-Played hide and seek game every day to practice modelling 'NOT'
Continue modelling WANT	- 'WANT' practice during food/mealtimes - Expressed 'STOP' on his own when using the Avaz for 'YES' and 'NO'
