Currently, culturally diverse AAC users have difficulty creating a personal likeness (voice, appearance, dialect). Presently, professionals have to take extra steps to personalize a device to fit the individual's needs, requiring extensive AAC programming knowledge and time.

IT'S A MATTER OF RESPECT

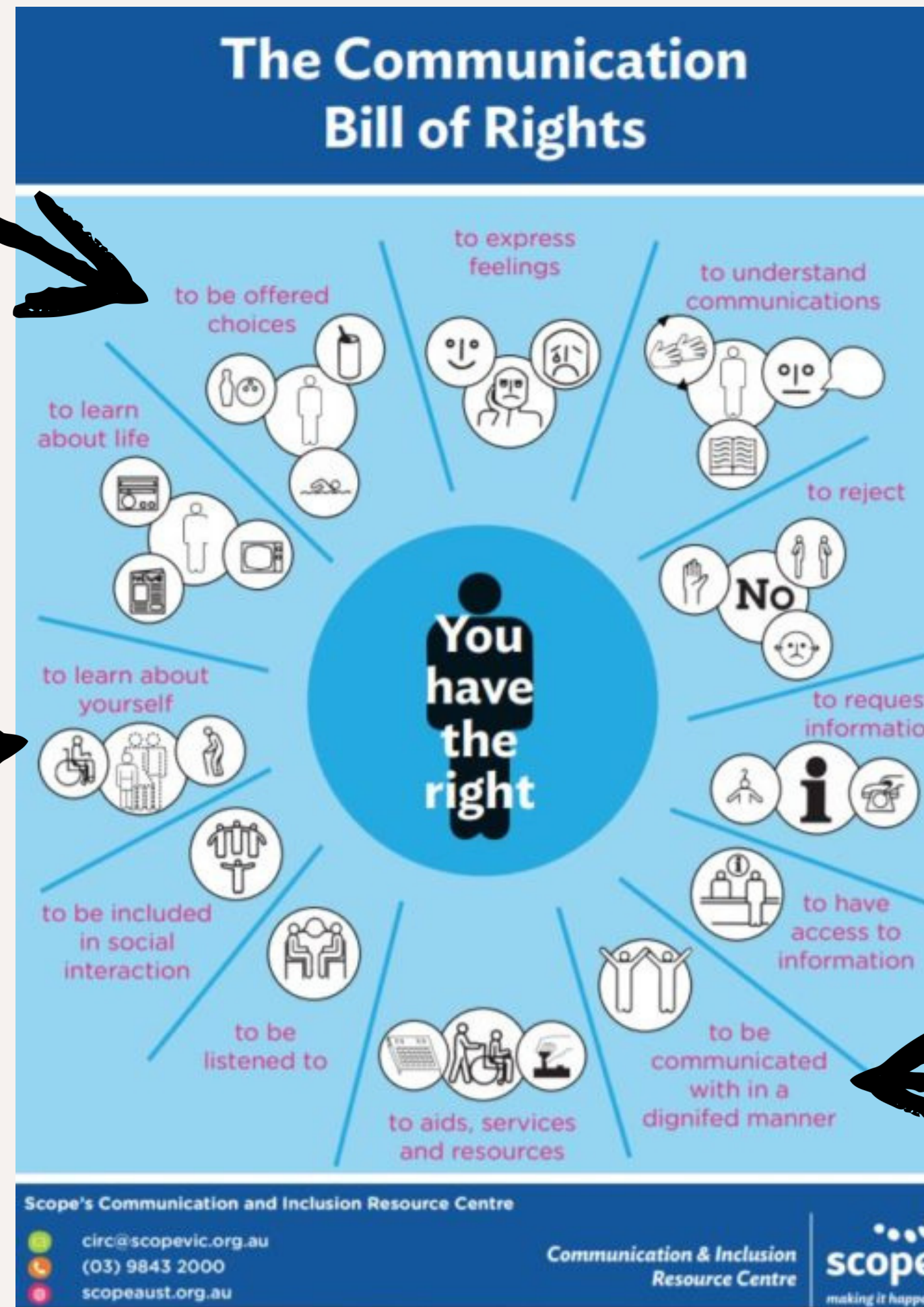
As professionals who respect the right and power of communication, we also encourage our AAC users to accept their device as part of their personal identity. The National Joint Committee for the Communication Needs of Persons With Severe Disabilities (NJCD) states that all people have “the right to have clear, meaningful, and culturally and linguistically appropriate communications.”

DON'T WAIT!



There is NO evidence to suggest that children have to be a certain chronological age to benefit from AAC (Ronski & Sevcik, 2005). One myth is the belief that introducing AAC at an early age will impede the development of verbal speech as the primary mode of communication.

Research has shown that the introduction of AAC actually improves verbal speech, **EVEN** when no speech therapy has been given (Ballinger, n.d.).

Self-awareness begins around 15-24 months when children start recognizing themselves in a mirror or photograph.



Theory of mind develops around age five.



The AAC system should represent how they choose to see themselves.



MULTILINGUALISM AND AAC

MYTH BUSTING: Because this AAC user struggles learning one language, he/she will struggle learning two. --- FALSE!

""There are no detrimental effects to the linguistic, cognitive, and social development of children, including those who use AAC...in fact maintenance of the home language is imperative!

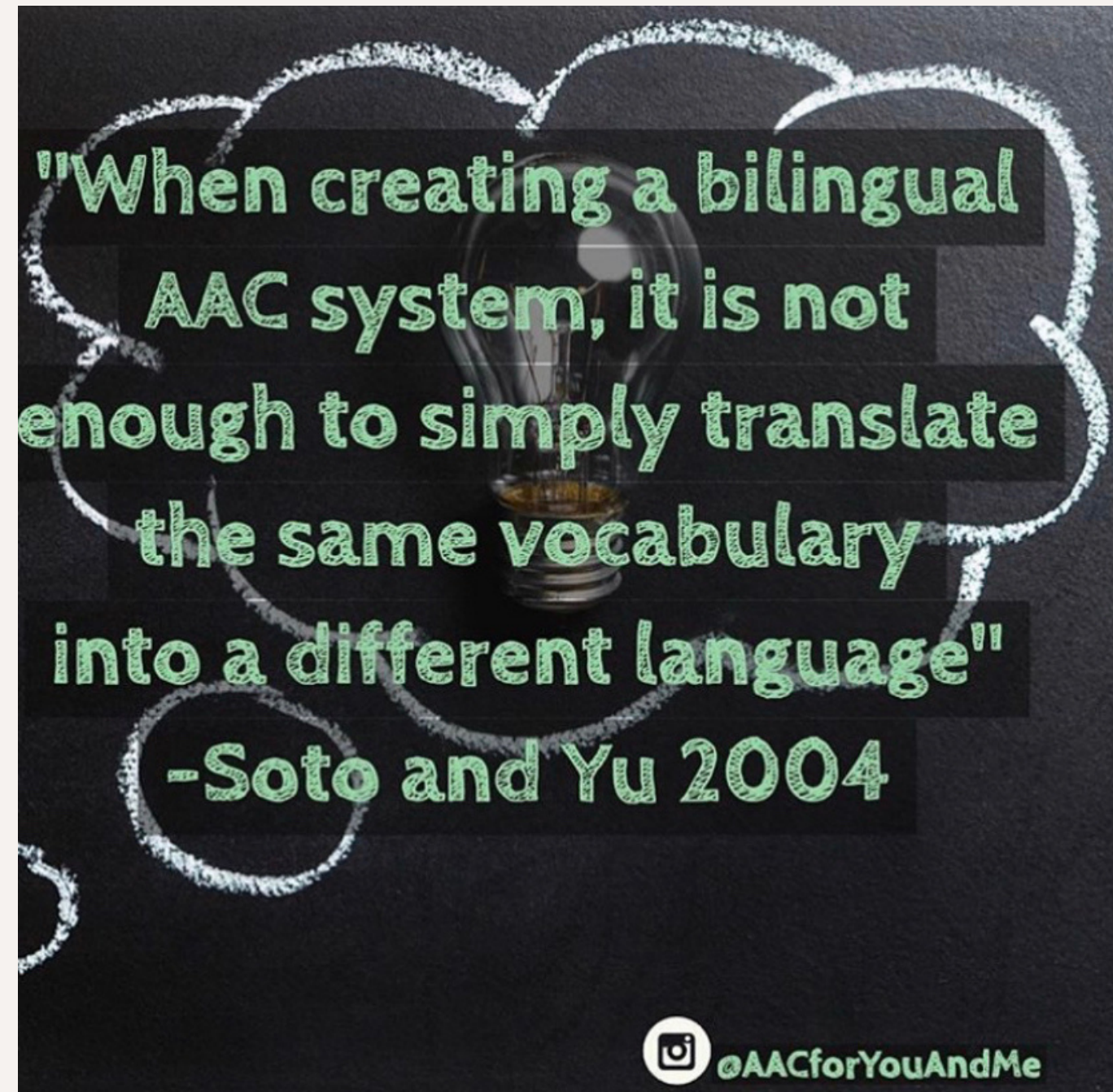
Need for culturally accessible, family-centered "training" as opposed to "parent training." Needs to be respectful, compassionate, informative and reciprocal- Gloria Soto, 2021- PALSs training (McNamara, 2018, Angulo-Jimenes 2018, Guiberson 2013)

IMPORTANT!

Research shows that once introduced to signs or unaided communication styles, Latino families preferred signs over high-tech AAC (McCord et al., 2004) and thought that AAC would be better used in the school settings (McCord et al., 2004, Blackstone, 1999; Huer et al., 2001.)

CONSIDERATIONS FOR AAC USE IN HOME LANGUAGE



Modeling language is different because the syntax is different (eg: Spanish: noun+adjective, English: adjective+noun)

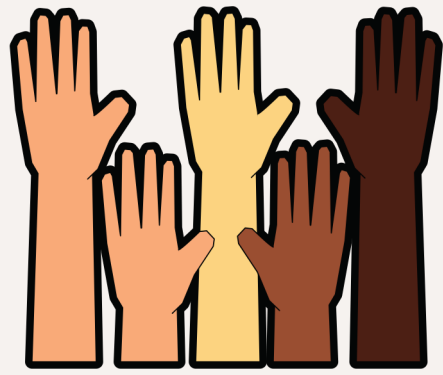
-It's not the same thing to translate icons or place a Spanish word on an English icon.

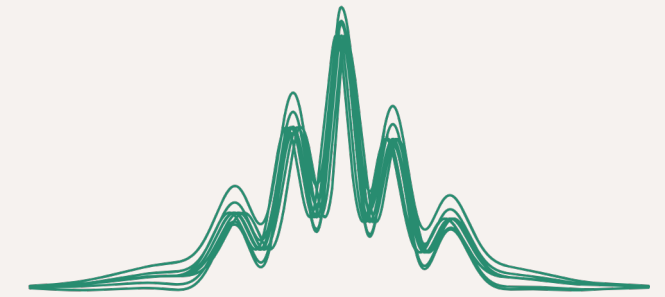

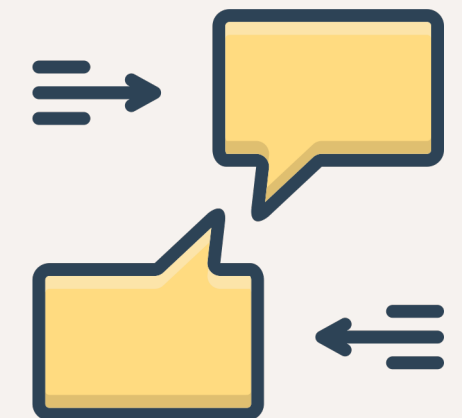

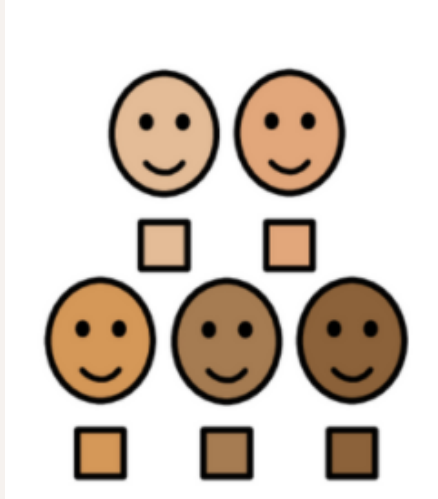
INCLUDE THE STUDENT AND FAMILY IN THE ICON AND LANGUAGE SELECTION PROCESS

"Personalization of the device, whether light tech or high tech, needs to happen **immediately** with the student's unique cultural or linguistic considerations in mind. Engaging the student in vocabulary and symbol selection...embeds the chosen vocabulary word/phrase and its associated symbol into the student's lexicon, possessing intrinsic meaning and value to the student."

"Vocabulary that includes extended family (or nontraditional families), heritage foods, religious engagement, cultural greetings, and so forth may also assist in bridging the AAC home–school divide. Icon selection also plays a significant role in facilitating family acceptance of AAC in the home. **Not all vocabulary is cross-linguistically available, and not all images are appropriate across cultures.**"

While most of the people in the clip art library are drawn fairly neutral and can be changed to any skin tone, these characters each have a unique identity.



These characters work well with our [Symbol Builder](#). Because the characters are shown in different positions, you can build custom images of one child, the same child, doing different tasks. (Hint: use a white circle or square to hide parts of images or people to replace with the character.)

Use Symbol Builder to make new symbols with the same character.

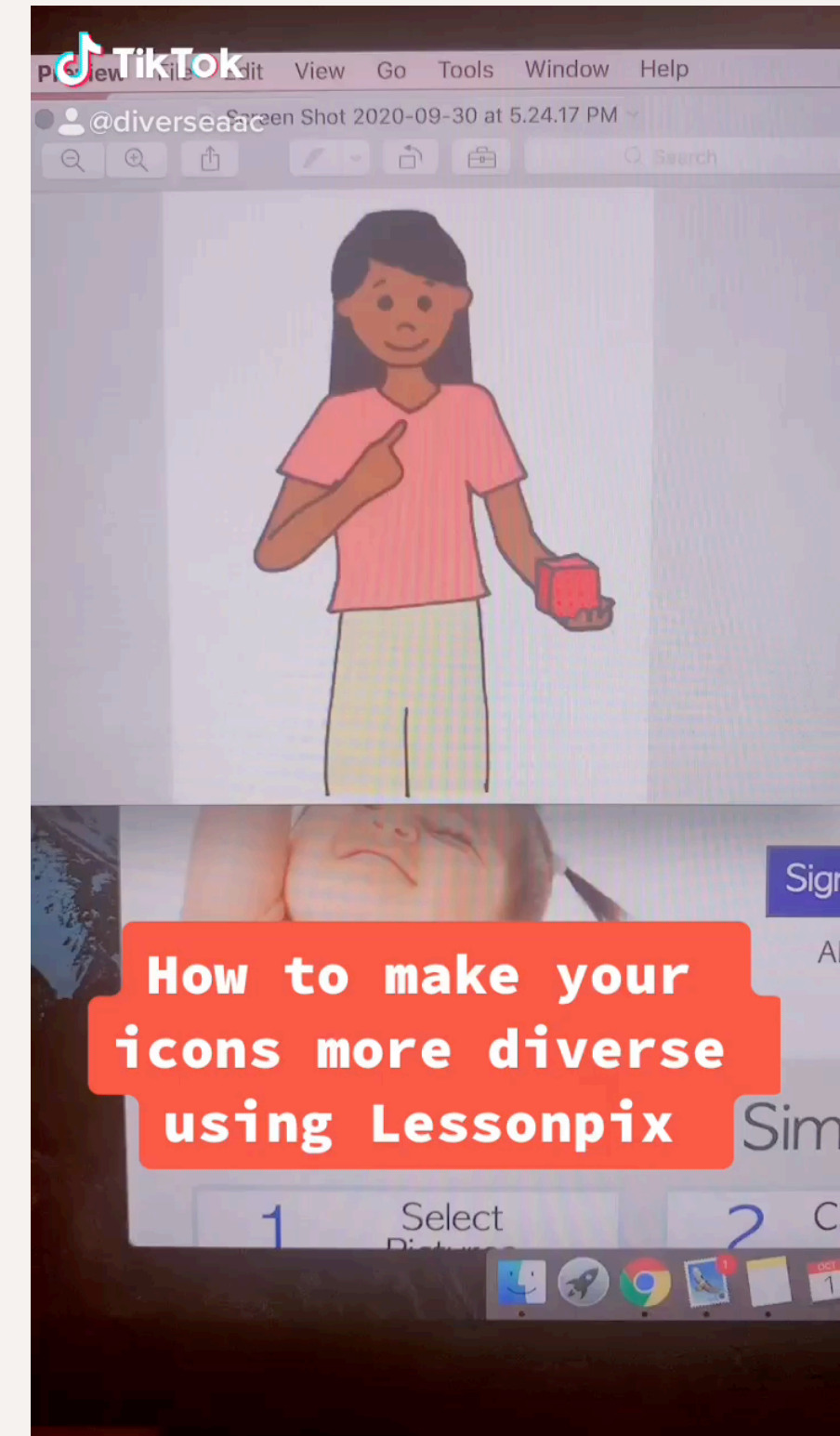
