
The Struggle – Finding Appropriate Books

- Students are reading below grade level
- Younger books aren't age appropriate
- Books that may be age appropriate *looking* don't have robust content
- There is not enough time to adapt/write all of the books that students need

CONSIDERATIONS FOR SELECTING BOOKS

- Students who are just learning about books
 - Need durable materials with the ability to explore
 - Need to learn concepts about print
- Students who are learning to read silentlyNeed LOTS of easy books to develop reading fluency
- Students who are able to listen to texts at a higher level than there silent reading abilities
 - Need books for listening at the appropriate level
 - **BUT, must always have instruction for their silent reading comprehension






EARLY CONVENTIONAL READERS NEED • A LOT of books


- Need to be easy books to build fluency
- Fluency is essential for comprehension
- Teach good vocabulary words and language concepts
- Student spending too much time figuring out words? Too hard=no fun!
- Book is TOO hard!






