The ISAAC 2012 Research Symposium will be held on August 3-4, 2012, directly following the 15th Biennial Conference of ISAAC, at the Forbes Tower, University of Pittsburgh. This site is a short distance by public transportation from the David L. Lawrence Convention Center, the main conference venue.

The ISAAC Research Symposium creates opportunities for in-depth discussion of research issues and needs related to AAC, with the goal of expanding the knowledge base of the field. The seminars (aka strands, themes or topics) consider theoretical, methodological and empirical issues related to AAC, both in core areas and areas where knowledge is insufficient or totally lacking. They may also address aspects of AAC use and development that are related to clinical practice (e.g., linguistics, cognitive science and social science). Although short papers will be presented, the emphasis is on allowing considerable time for discussion and encouraging participants to make substantive contributions and/or to request clarification or expansion on topics of interest.
