

It was a very exciting visit as many of the strategies we use at The Bridge School are now in place in Chennai and Kolkata, India. Here are a few photos from our journey, starting at SRM University in Chennai:

Usha Dalvi was our first Teacher in Residence in 1998-99. She is currently teaching at SRM University. Our team, consisting of Holly Peartree, SLP at The Bridge School, Stephanie Taymuree, SLP and Special Educator from T.A.C.L.E. in Oakland, CA, Christine Roman Lantzy, CVI Specialist from Pittsburgh, PA, presented to faculty, staff, and students in Speech, Language, and Audiology Studies.





Our most recent Teacher in Residence (2014-15), Krithika Venkatraman, works at Vidya Sagar, a special school in Chennai, India. Krithika has been very successful in implementing many of the strategies she practiced at The Bridge School.
