Pan American Health Organization (PAHO) AAC Webinar





This month, the journal saw the release of Volume 41, Issue 4, our final issue of 2025. Articles published in this issue examine mental health of AAC users, synthetic child speech in South African languages, communication access in restaurant settings, spelling in communication, parentimplemented AAC intervention, reflections of special education teachers, and smart AAC technologies. Alongside these articles, the issue also recognizes achievements of excellence with the 2024 Editor's Awards for "Most Significant Research Article" and "Most Significant Student Paper," for papers published in the previous volume of the journal. We congratulate these researchers on their contributions to the field, and their papers will be available for free download for the next year.

The journal would also like to pay tribute to Alice Wong, who passed away this November. A pillar of the AAC community and the disability justice movement, Alice dedicated her life to challenging systemic barriers and amplifying the experiences of all those living with disabilities. Alice shared her lived experience with a neuromuscular disability across various outlets, including social media, podcasts, and advisory councils, and the journal is especially fortunate to have published her article, "How Ableism Impacts People Who Need and Use AAC," in Volume 41, Issue 3, our September special issue on perspectives of AAC users and collaborative research. Alice's article is available for free access online, and we continue to celebrate her life and impact as we anticipate a future where everyone, as she said, can be "[their] full selves unapologetically."

ISAAC-Denmark



The board of Isaac Denmark consists of nine resolute members. We are users, SLPs, consultants, AAC coaches, university professors, teachers, and Occupational Therapists. A highly active and competent board! Our most important activity in ISAAC Denmark was our conference in March (pictured below). We had 280 participants the biggest conference ever! The conference was over 2 days, and speakers were both Danish and international practitioners, researchers, and specialists. Participants were from all over Denmark (ok we are a little country, so it is not that far!) and represented all kinds of people interested in AAC. We were very keen on making room for networking and exchanging experiences among the participants. The next conference program is ready and will take place on the 23 and 24 of March 2026.

A part of the conference is the meeting for users of AAC. Their program includes planning interesting assemblies for users. The last event was in September where 12 users were working together with a gaming specialist on how to use joysticks, switches. etc. It was so successful, and the participants had so much fun that we finally got rumors around the country about the event and had families contacting us for more of this.

We consider it a significant success. We had good funding, which is helping the finances, but our challenge is that AAC users in Denmark often have very few days a year where they can leave their homes and travel due to the community's way of enforcing legislation in supporting people with disabilities. So, people would like to participate but cannot get assistants.



AAC Awareness Month in Denmark was also one of our main initiatives. We decided to go all in with our social media, and we had superior results, especially activity on Facebook and LinkedIn. We made a campaign of small "How to..." videos on nice user stories and links to activities, the ISAAC International Virtual Event, a new Danish TV Series about seldom Danish children – one of them is an AAC user, and the community election campaign pushing the electees to take care of disabled people. We have 1,400 followers on the Danish Facebook - rather good for a small country like ours.

Besides this, our activities cover working with accessibility, finetuning our homepage, collaborating with communities' unwillingness to allocate communication aids, and following up on the disability/ability agenda in Danish political discussions.

And, at last, we are celebrating, that our co-work with the Danish educational system has resulted in, a full Diploma in AAC at the Bachelor level!
