AAC Awareness Month — “Vibes of AAC” Virtual Event

We have had a very successful 2024 Awareness Month! The theme for AAC Awareness Month 2024 was “Vibes of AAC”, and our signature event for 2024, the “Vibes of AAC Virtual Event”, was a tremendous success.

With nearly 500 participants online from all over the world, attendees were able to access over 50 presentations, made by leading AAC voices from around the world.

In addition to the live presentations, all sessions were recorded, and those recorded sessions are still available for viewing. If you were not able to

purchase a ticket for the live event, you can still [purchase a ticket](#) for access to all recorded sessions.

And for those registrants who are also ASHA members, ASHA CEUs can be claimed for viewing all recorded sessions. More information is available from the “My Account” page [of our event website](#), once you log into your account.

ISAAC, as an organization, also prides itself on employing available tools and technologies in a continuous effort of self-improvement, in order to better meet and achieve the mission and goals of the organization. And our “Vibes of AAC” online event was no exception!

ISAAC was able to employ a new, self-hosted and self-managed event website, in order to better support event registration for this event, and for future events. Combining this with our existing credit card transaction accounts, means that ISAAC is now able to ensure it minimizes expenditures on bank and other financial transaction service charges.

Also, for the first time, and in keeping with the directives of the ISAAC Council and Executive Board, ISAAC is now able to better manage conference related currency exchange fluctuations, by now charging event registrations

in US dollars. We anticipate that this change will have its greatest positive impact for our next in-person conference, when minimization of currency exchange fluctuations will assist in expenditure control.

Finally, ISAAC was able to deploy new technology to support AI generation of translated captions for our sessions, into seven languages. As with any new technology or process, there is a learning curve involved, with both the technology itself and with the manner in which that technology was implemented. In the end, the majority of recorded sessions do have translated captioning available, and we are taking the lessons learned from this first experience, to work towards improving our performance with this technology at our next opportunity.

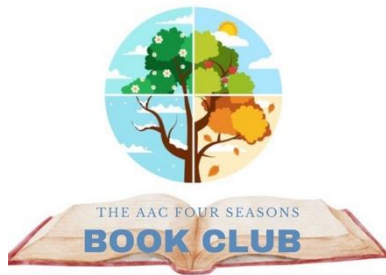

Update from the ISAAC Research Committee

ISAAC's activities are supported by its members through standing committees and working groups that focus on specific responsibilities. One of these standing committees is the Research Committee (RC). The RC currently comprises ten members from around the world who meet monthly. Inherently, people who use AAC are active members of the RC. We have different occupational backgrounds, such as speech-language pathology, psychology, special education, assistive technology, pedagogy, and law. The RC is responsible for monitoring the development of research activities within ISAAC International. Activities include the (biennial) ISAAC Research Symposium, held in conjunction with the ISAAC Conference. The RC also considers strategies to encourage established and young researchers (e.g., students) to engage in state-of-the-art developments in the field. The RC reports to ISAAC's Executive Board (EB). The current chair is Kristine Stadskleiv, and she can be contacted (krisstad@uio.no) with queries about the work of the committee.

At the ISAAC Vibes of AAC Conference in October, the RC hosted a research

symposium. According to our terms of reference, the RC is responsible for the promotion of research in all areas of AAC. We therefore decided to devote the symposium to topics and methodological issues that we found to be underrepresented in the current AAC research field. The two topics of the Research Symposium were: **(1) Mental health and mental health considerations for AAC users**, and **(2) Including AAC users as co-researchers**. These topics were introduced and discussed with international expert panels. In connection with this, we launched a short survey to gather input from respondents on the inclusion of mental health in their agendas, the availability and accessibility of mental health support for AAC users, and the resources currently used to identify and address mental health issues. Additionally, the survey aims to understand the current level of involvement of AAC users in research and gather ideas on how they can be meaningfully included in the research process as co-researchers, as well as identify future priorities for AAC research. **The survey is still open online and will remain so until January 10th. You can access and answer the survey, which takes approximately 5 minutes, at <https://nettskjema.no/a/464271>.**

Our current focus is on disseminating the results from the research symposium and the survey. To achieve this, we are planning two manuscripts based on the discussions during the symposium and the survey. One manuscript will discuss the issues of mental health and mental health problems among persons who use AAC and the other will focus on how to include people who use AAC in qualitative research and as co-researchers. Our goal is to have both manuscripts submitted during the first half of 2025.

The Communication Matters (CM) annual [International AAC Conference](#) took place at the University of Leeds from 8-10th September 2024.

A record 440 delegates which included 40 AAC users attended. It is great that nearly 10% of attendees were AAC users. CM were pleased to be able to subsidise 88 places this year for AAC users and their PAs and family members to attend. There was also a fantastic exhibition with 17 companies exhibiting. We are grateful for their support and sponsorship.



The feedback has been that the presentations were of a very high quality this year and they covered a fantastic range of topics. Thank you to all the presenters. Thank you also to our fantastic Keynote and Plenary speakers, Professor Annalu Waller ([left image](#)) and Helen Robinson ([right image](#)), for bookending the conference with such inspirational messages. Following the work that CM Trustees Beth Moulam and Helen Hewson started at last year's Conference entitled "Our Futures", the Sunday afternoon activity at registration of CM2024 aimed to continue this work ([below](#)).

The activity gave each delegate an opportunity to tell the CM Trustees what they needed to empower AAC users to achieve their goals. 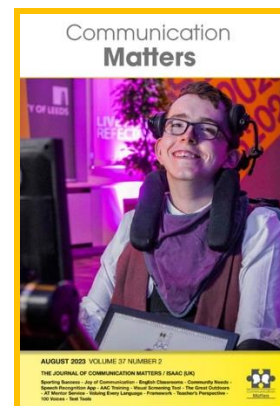

AAC Journal

The last few months of 2024 have been productive and busy for *Augmentative and Alternative Communication*!

In September, the journal saw the release of Volume 40, Issue 3, which collected a new selection of research from the field. Articles published in this issue examine eye tracking technologies, AAC instruction for young children on the autism spectrum, AAC intervention and the Family of Participation-Related Constructs framework, teaching AAC strategies in South Africa, simultaneous visual and motor impairment,

and AAC users' experiences with mental health services.

In December, the journal celebrated the release of Volume 40, Issue 4, our final issue of 2024. This issue features research on AAC in the pediatric intensive care unit, AAC service providers in Canada, core vocabulary lists for AAC, speech generating devices, competency of speech language pathologists in AAC, representation of AAC in contemporary young adult fiction, and functional communication training. Alongside the articles, the issue also recognizes several achievements of excellence: the 2023 Editor's Awards for "Most Significant Research Paper" and "Most Significant Student Paper," the dedication of volunteer Associate Editors and Reviewers, and a final send-off for longtime Editorial Assistant Jackie Brown, who retired in June 2024 after 25 years of service.

The next issue of AAC will be released in March 2024, and articles continue to be published on a rolling basis online via Taylor & Francis. Thank you to the many contributors, Associate Editors, and Reviewers who continue to make AAC a success year after year. The Editorial Team wishes you a safe and happy holiday season, and we look forward to receiving new manuscripts in 2025.
