Strategic Plan 2026-2029

In the strategic plan, we would like to address several important points:

1. Understanding how ISAAC can be of help to the local chapters:

These days we are busy writing ideas for discussions with Chapter Chairs, and in the coming months, we will initiate meetings to understand how to promote these issues.

2. Collaborations with various organizations that focus on AAC around the world:

These collaborations are essential for promoting better communication access for individuals who use AAC, sharing best practices, raising awareness, providing training support, advocating for policy changes at national levels, and offering resource developments, all through global networking.

3. Expanding awareness of AAC in developing countries:

We are increasing our efforts for expanding awareness of AAC in countries around the world without ISAAC chapters. For example, we have started helping build a group of AAC stakeholders in China.

ISAAC Conference

I have received numerous personal inquiries from ISAAC members asking about our next in-person conference. ISAAC International remains committed to presenting an in-person conference in Italy, as previously announced.

Having said that, organizing and presenting an in-person conference represents a significant financial outlay for any organization, and ISAAC is no different in that regard. Currently, ISAAC needs to take into consideration the following economic realities:

1. The post-COVID global recession and high rates of inflation in many countries limits individuals' abilities for discretionary spending on travel.

2. The same inflationary factors have increased the costs of airfare, hotel, and food/beverage, further impacting discretionary spending.

3. The current trade tariffs situation, unclear now, will impact both United States and Canada's stock markets and currencies, which are the main currencies used by ISAAC.

4. The new administration in the United States has announced budget cuts at the *...continued on page 3*

National Institutes of Health (NIH), which could impact conference travel funding received by ISAAC stakeholder groups.

As a result of the above instability and uncertainty, ISAAC will continue to postpone its next in-person conference presentation.

We do, however, look forward to presenting another virtual this year during AAC Awareness Month in October.

In October 2024, our "Vibes of AAC" online event was a success, with nearly 500 participants from all over the world. Following this event, we are beginning to work towards building the next virtual ISAAC conference that will also take place at the end of the AAC Awareness Month in October 2025.

This issue of The ISAAC Communicator contains more information on this, and we will continue to share updates as we proceed into 2025.

ISAAC Chapters around the world continue to organize in-person conferences and events within their regions. I'm happy to promote the upcoming Communication Matters (ISAAC UK) in-person conference happening in September 2025: A theme of 'Identity' has been set for this year's Communication Matters International AAC Conference, taking place 8th-9th of September in Leeds, England. This very current and broad topic hopes to open conversation and highlight work being done around how AAC users explore, connect with and share their identity. This could be within areas looking at, but not exclusive to, gender, culture and/or race, personcentered service delivery, self-advocacy, AI, technological advances, and neurodiversity. The Call for Papers is open until the 16th of April, and we encourage all to consider submitting an abstract to ensure a broad representation of perspective. For more information please visit:

Welcome to the March 2025 edition of The ISAAC Communicator.

Another spring has "sprung" here in the northern hemisphere, and this always represents a time of hope, renewal, and warmer temperatures! 2025 is shaping up to be both an exciting and challenging year for ISAAC International.

As for the challenges, two of the most significant ones (at the time of writing) are:

1. There is currently a tariff war in place between Canada and the United States, two neighbours who are each other's largest trading partners, and who share the world's longest non-militarized border. This will no doubt have a significant impact on the economies of both countries, including inflation, employment, stock market wealth, and currency exchange rates. 2. A new administration was elected in the United States last November, and that administration took office during January of this year. Already, the administration has taken action to cut funding in order to reduce budget deficits. Notably, we are aware of reports about possible funding cuts to the US National Institutes of Health (NIH), which could have significant impacts for the field of AAC, ISAAC, and our stakeholder groups, globally. <u>Many in the field are naturally</u> <u>concerned about the impact this could have</u> <u>on people who use AAC, their families,</u> <u>practitioners, and researchers</u>.

As a result, we here at ISAAC International are going to be especially focused during 2025 on ensuring that we deliver value to our members first and foremost, continue to have a positive impact on the field of AAC, and safeguard the well-being of our organization.

And here are a few examples of how we are going to follow through in doing this during the year...

ISAAC 2025 Virtual Event

Following up on the tremendous success of last year's virtual "Vibes of AAC" online event, ISAAC is now planning the presentation of a 2025 virtual event.

ISAAC was thrilled to launch, for last year's event, our new <u>online event/conference</u> <u>website</u>. This website provides ISAAC with the flexibility to self-manage registration for our own paid events, thereby allowing us to be more efficient and effective as an organization. We will be using this same website once again to manage registration for this year's online event.

Although no formal dates have yet been set, we anticipate presenting our 2025 virtual event, once again, during AAC Awareness Month in October.

Also, and in keeping with the global nature of ISAAC, we are planning on involving our ISAAC Council, Research Committee, Chapters, and non-Chapter regions to ensure that we achieve as broad a range of submissions as possible for this event.

Keep watching the ISAAC website, social media channels, and monitor your email over the course of the coming few weeks, as we provide more information.

Strategic Plan, 2026-29

The ISAAC Executive Board (EB) is focusing this year on the next iteration of our strategic plan,

to cover the four-year period of 2026 through 2029. ISAAC's <u>current strategic plan</u> is available for viewing from the ISAAC website, and the EB will, of course, need to present its new strategic plan to the ISAAC Council.

ISAAC Council Meeting, 2025

ISAAC Council Meetings are, in accordance with our Governance Handbook, linked to the presentation of our Biennial in-person Conference.

Since there is no in-person conference planned during 2025 (see the comments from our President in this issue of The ISAAC Communicator about this), a Special Meeting of the ISAAC Council has been called for October 23rd, 2025, beginning at 11 am Eastern (Toronto) time, and Council members have been made aware of the date, time and connect details by way of electronic communication (email and website). ISAAC Growth Opportunities

ISAAC International is always looking for opportunities to expand the breadth and depth of our reach, as it relates to the field of AAC globally. To this end, we are involved in activities including:

- Assisting groups around the world, particularly those in developing AAC countries, with creating connections to the global AAC community, as a means of generating additional growth in membership and publication subscriptions
- Working collaboratively with the Editors and Editorial Assistant of our AAC journal, we want to leverage our own in-house Communications team as a means of achieving overall growth of impact factor, revenue, and other journal key metrics


