This year’s edition of the ISAAC International Forum is being presented in Zagreb, Croatia on October 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>, immediately preceding the 2026 ATAAC Conference.

ISAAC International will also be presenting, during November 2026, the next “edition” of its highly successful and informative Virtual Conference.

ISAAC International is working hard to get our [online registration system](#) ready for online ticket sales for both of these events. We anticipate making additional announcements of the opening of registration for both events soon, which will be done by eblast, social media blast, and by posting on both our [event](#) and [ISAAC International](#) websites.

## **ISAAC International Website Redevelopment Project**

Speaking about websites, ISAAC International is now beginning its main website redevelopment project. Put off by our need to develop our own online event website, the organization is now ready to put the necessary time, energy, and effort into a full redevelopment of its main website, which went live “way back when” in 2011.

The first phase of the re-development project is being led by our Manager of Communications, [Cheryl Jackson](#). Cheryl will be engaging directly with key stakeholders, including Chapter and Council leadership, in

one-on-one conversations. The purpose of these conversations is to seek input from those who have already been involved in similar efforts, and to better identify how ISAAC could leverage a new website and updated technology to provide more efficient and effective services and the sharing of information to our stakeholder communities.

Following this initial phase, the next task will be to create a detailed assessment of functionalities to be incorporated into a new website, that will permit ISAAC to meet its key strategic goals and objectives, as outlined in the 2026-2029 version of its Strategic Plan.

### **Strategic Plan, 2026-29**

The ISAAC Executive Board (EB) last year completed the work associated with the transition to its Strategic Plan, 2026-29, which was approved by the ISAAC Council. Full versions of ISAAC's Strategic Plans, including the latest version, are posted on the [ISAAC website](#).

I would like to take this opportunity to thank both the ISAAC EB and Council for all the effort in

creating, reviewing, and passing this key governance document. The importance of creating and successfully implementing a Strategic Plan on behalf of our organization cannot be overstated!

### **ISAAC Council Meeting, 2026**

ISAAC Council Meetings are, in accordance with our Governance Handbook, linked to the presentation of our Biennial in-person Conference.

Since there is no in-person "Biennial Conference" planned during 2026, a Special Meeting of the ISAAC Council will be called, and Council members will be made aware of the date and time of the meeting by way of electronic communication (email and website).

### **ISAAC Executive Board, 2024-26 and 2026-28**

Inextricably linked with scheduling a Special Meeting of the ISAAC Council in 2026, is the governance requirement to publish a proposed slate for the new ISAAC Executive Board that will hold office during the 2026-2028 period.

Led by the [ISAAC Nominations Committee](#), this process identifies qualified individuals willing and interested in taking on a leadership role with ISAAC International. Any such interested

The ISAAC In-Person Conference Budget Decision Guidelines document is a high-level overview of the preconditions required to organize a full international in-person ISAAC Biennial Conference. ISAAC International recognizes the feedback from many in our community, of the wish to re-start the presentation of full in-person biennial conferences as soon as possible. The ISAAC Executive Board shares this goal, and is actively taking steps to make this happen, which is why ISAAC is continuing, in 2026, with its very successful annual virtual events, and is this year launching the new ISAAC Forum event.

## AAC Mentorship Program BUILD Committee

The **AAC Mentorship Program** is an initiative of the **BUILD Committee of ISAAC International**, designed to strengthen competencies, leadership, and support networks within the global Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) community, with particular attention to contexts with limited access to training and resources.

This program connects **ISAAC members with experience in AAC**—including professionals, families, and AAC users—with other members who wish to **learn, grow, and receive targeted support**, fostering a collaborative, ethical, and context-responsive exchange of knowledge.

### **How does it work?**

Mentorships are structured as intentional learning relationships with **clearly defined goals, an agreed time frame, and shared expectations**, focused on mutual learning and capacity building while respecting cultural, linguistic, and communicative diversity.

### **Who can participate?**

**ISAAC International members** may apply as **Mentors or Mentees**, including:

- AAC professionals
- Families
- AAC users

There is no single required profile or level of expertise. Participation is based on a **willingness to share experiences, learn collaboratively, and engage actively** within the ISAAC community.

### **Expected impact**

Through this program, the BUILD Committee aims to:

- Reduce inequities in access to AAC training and support
- Strengthen local and regional leadership
- Recognize and share diverse knowledge and lived experience
- Build a sustainable international AAC support network
